DEDICATION:
The composition of numbers 2, 3, 6, 7, and 8 is ascribed to Padre Narciso Durấn (1776-1846), to whom this present edition is dedicated. Born In Catalonia, Spain, he came to California in 1806 at the age of 30 , and was assigned to Mission San José. It was there that he began the life long bask of teaching the mission Indians the art of singing, and playing instruments. During 27 years he built up a choir and orchestra consisting of some 30 members, singing and playing on strings, flates, trumpets and drums. In 1833 he was transferred to Mission Santa Barbara, where he built up a similar ensemble, working with it until his last days.
