As soon as this bar begins, conductor will point to each of the four sections of the choir, in the order $A-B-S-T$, to begin this melodic phrase. The members of those sections begin at random, singing the phrase four times, ending by sustaining the "ges" of "nuages" on the final pitch. Stagger breath at this point so sound may be continuous.
(2) As soon as conductor hears that all voices have reached the final pitch he begins this section. The voices continue in random entrances, sustaining the pitch by singing "nuages" in individually free, but slow, tempos.
(3) After this bar begins, conductor cues sections on the beat, as indicated above the score. As soon as their section is cued, the individuals sing bracketed phrase once, very slowly, with random entrances. Singers sustain the final B on "---ges" until conductor cues them all to continue at bar 58, now in tempo with strings.
