PERFORMANCE NOTES

Part of the excitement of a parade is the anticipation of the relentless approach of the marchers. This piece should create that same anticipation and excitement. The "*mp/mf*" of the opening verses should have quiet vowels, but energetic consonants, as if from a distance. In Verse 2, as the Middle voices have the melody, the outer voices should be very careful to imitate the celebratory ringing of bells and not overshadow the melody.

Throughout the piece, be attentive to the "action words" in the text; "get ready," "We'll give," "to fill with joy." In the same way, be attentive to the fricative consonants like "f" (as in "feel") and the "th" (as in "then"). Also, the double consonants at the beginnings of words, like "gr" (as in "great") and the "pl" (as in "pleasures") because details like these can otherwise be difficult for the audience to hear. It is the responsibility of every singer in the chorus to make these articulation-related adjustments so that the text can be correctly and clearly presented to the audience.

Sing this piece with faith and courage; it is important for our heroes to know that we value and honor them!
