PERFORMANCE NOTES

This arrangement may be sung SAB voices by leaving out the tenor part. On the last two chords, men sing the tenor part.

The word, "dance" should not be pronounced with a broad. American vowel, but more of a modified British "ah."

The fourth stanza is to be spoken as follows:

Men: Use a spooky, floating (head voice) sound. The words, "thought I'd gone," should be stretched and much slower—the last word slowly descending in pitch and fading into silence. The word, "but," should be shouted as forcibly as possible.

Women: Speak quietly, but with a ring to the sound and strong emphasis upon concluding consonants, exactly on the tied eighth notes. The word, "gone," should be like a siren on the vowel—up and down as outlined by the jagged line, then fading slowly to silence.

This stanza should be performed with great freedom, stressing important words and consonants.
